Northern Securities (JP Morgan)v. Unites States</p> <p>“The most powerful men in the country were held to accountability before the law” TR=Trustbuster</p> <p>United Mine Workers v. Owners TR=arbitration</p> <p>TR= breaking trusts more bad than good, created a new federal agency to investigate and keep public informed</p> <p>Department of Commerce and Labor</p> <p>Hepburn Act=stronger ICC to help regulate RR but did not work</p>
<p>Meat Inspection Act/Pure Food and Drug Act</p>	<p>Informs and protects consumers what they are buying and consuming and raises acceptable standards.</p>
<p>Conservation</p>	<p>Gifford Pinchot—US Forest Service—100 million acres of protected national forests and 5 new national parks</p>
<p>Taft</p>	<p>TR warns don’t mess around with Tariffs</p> <p>Payne Aldrich Tariff</p> <p>James R. Garfield replaced by Richard A Ballinger</p> <p>Pinchot charges Garfield with privatizing public lands</p> <p>Disliked despite twice as many anti-trust suits than TR, established the Children’s Bureau and equaled or surpassed TR in conservation.</p> <p>Taft brings antitrust against US Steel?? TR approved</p>
