Legal Tender Act	Created a national currency—Greenbacks help pay for the war in the North—In south 9,000% inflation 80% in North												
Peace Democrats vs. War Democrats vs. Abolitionist Republicans	<p>Democrats who oppose war and called for reuniting the states through negotiation=Copperheads</p> <p>Conscription if states could not recruit enough volunteers</p> <p>Lincoln again suspends habeas corpus, “Must I shoot a simple-minded soldier boy who deserts, while I must not touch a hair of a wily agitator who induces him to desert?”</p>												
Southern Challenges	Weak Government=states rights=no money + no conscription + no support for suspending habeas												
Trent Affair	“One war at a time” South seeking foreign support, knows that Britain and France depend on southern cotton												
The First Modern War	<p>Conoidal Bullets—trench warfare—old battlefield methods=very crude and bloody battles and injuries</p> <p>War of attrition??</p>												
Southern Strategy	Play Defense—North will become tired of war—not all southern approve												
Northern Strategy	<p>Anaconda plan—Winfield Scott—time vs. bloodshed</p> <p>Not all northerners approve—quick decisive victory</p>
