<p>Date— Class—US History</p>	<p>Gilded Age Presidents—Roosevelt</p>
<p>Rutherford B. Hayes— Republican—1876-1880</p>	<p>Compromise of 1877—Ohio—Harvard Law School— fought in the Civil War—Member of the House of Rep.</p>
<p>James A. Garfield— Republican—1880-1881</p>	<p>Ohio—Senator—Civil War Veteran—“Dark Horse” candidate—attempted to strengthen the presidency— Assassinated by Charles Guiteau</p>
<p>Chester A. Arthur— Republican—1881-1884</p>	<p>Vermont—Pendleton Act—1st ever immigration laws-- No man ever entered the Presidency so profoundly and widely distrusted, and no one ever retired ... more generally respected."—Died shortly after leaving office</p>
<p>Grover Cleveland— Democrat--1884-1888</p>	<p>New Jersey—Governor of NY—1st Dem after Civil War—Reformer—only president married in the White House—Interstate Commerce Act—many of his reforms upset even his own party—William Jennings Bryant</p>
<p>Benjamin Harrison— Republican—1888-1892</p>	<p>Indiana—Lawyer—Front porch campaign—won election despite losing popular vote—grandfather William Henry Harrison—Sherman Anti-Trust Act--</p>
<p>Grover Cleveland— Democrat—1892-1896</p>	<p>This guy wasn't so bad after all</p>
<p>William McKinley— Republican—1896—1900</p>	<p>Ohio—Lawyer—Governor—McKinley Tariff—Spanish American War—“Full Dinner Pail”—annexed Philippines, Guam and Puerto Rico—Assassinated by Leon Czolgosz—vp as Theodore Roosevelt</p>
<p>Theodore Roosevelt— Republican—1900-1908</p>	<p>New York—Progressive--</p>
