Sugar Act (American Revenue Act)	Presumed guilty, goods seized w/o due process, "No taxation without representation"
Currency Act	Farmers upset, no more issuing paper money for loans
Stamp Act	1 <sup>st</sup> direct tax, Oct. 1765 nine representatives meet for Stamp Act Congress—Create a Dec. of Rights and Grievances and Ask for relief and repeal of Stamp Act Boycott and Non-importation agreement of British Goods Parliament repeals but passes Declaratory Act=Parliament has the power to tax colonies
Townshend Act	New tax on glass, lead, paper, paint, TEAWrits of Assistance= do not need proper search warrant
Boston Massacre (1768)	British are tyrants who are willing to kill people who stood up for their rights Michael Johnson=Crispus Attucks British repeal all Townshend Act except for Tea and allow
Sons and Daughters of Liberty	colonies to assemble=temporary peace Sons=small band of patriot colonists that would plan attacks on tax collectors and hold rallys, boycotts etc Sam Adams, Patrick Henry, GW, TJ Daughters=homespun, wearing became sign of support
The Gaspee Affair (June 1772)	British main anti-smuggling ship was destroyed off coast of RI. TJ suggests that each colony create a committee of correspondence
Boston Tea Party (May 1773)	Parliament passes law allowing East India Company relief from tax=Dutch tea cheaper than American. Also no middleman for distributing Tea

Coercive or Intolerable Acts	Shut down Boston Harbor, no elected officials, banned town meetings, Quartering of troops, appointed General Thomas Gage, Quebec Act
