<p>Date—</p> <p>Class--</p>	<p>Road to Revolution</p>
<p>Sugar Act (American Revenue Act)</p>	<p>Presumed guilty, goods seized w/o due process, “No taxation without representation”</p>
<p>Currency Act</p>	<p>Farmers upset, no more issuing paper money for loans</p>
<p>Stamp Act</p>	<p>1st direct tax, Oct. 1765 nine representatives meet for Stamp Act Congress—Create a Dec. of Rights and Grievances and Ask for relief and repeal of Stamp Act Boycott and Non-importation agreement of British Goods Parliament repeals but passes Declaratory Act=Parliament has the power to tax colonies</p>
<p>Townshend Act</p>	<p>New tax on glass, lead, paper, paint, TEA Writs of Assistance= do not need proper search warrant</p>
<p>Boston Massacre (1768)</p>	<p>British are tyrants who are willing to kill people who stood up for their rights Michael Johnson=Crispus Attucks British repeal all Townshend Act except for Tea and allow colonies to assemble=temporary peace</p>
<p>Sons and Daughters of Liberty</p>	<p>Sons=small band of patriot colonists that would plan attacks on tax collectors and hold rallies, boycotts etc.. Sam Adams, Patrick Henry, GW, TJ Daughters=homespun, wearing became sign of support</p>
<p>The Gaspee Affair (June 1772)</p>	<p>British main anti-smuggling ship was destroyed off coast of RI. TJ suggests that each colony create a committee of correspondence</p>
<p>Boston Tea Party (May 1773)</p>	<p>Parliament passes law allowing East India Company relief from tax=Dutch tea cheaper than American. Also no middleman for distributing Tea</p>

Coercive or Intolerable Acts	Shut down Boston Harbor, no elected officials, banned town meetings, Quartering of troops, appointed General Thomas Gage, Quebec Act
